

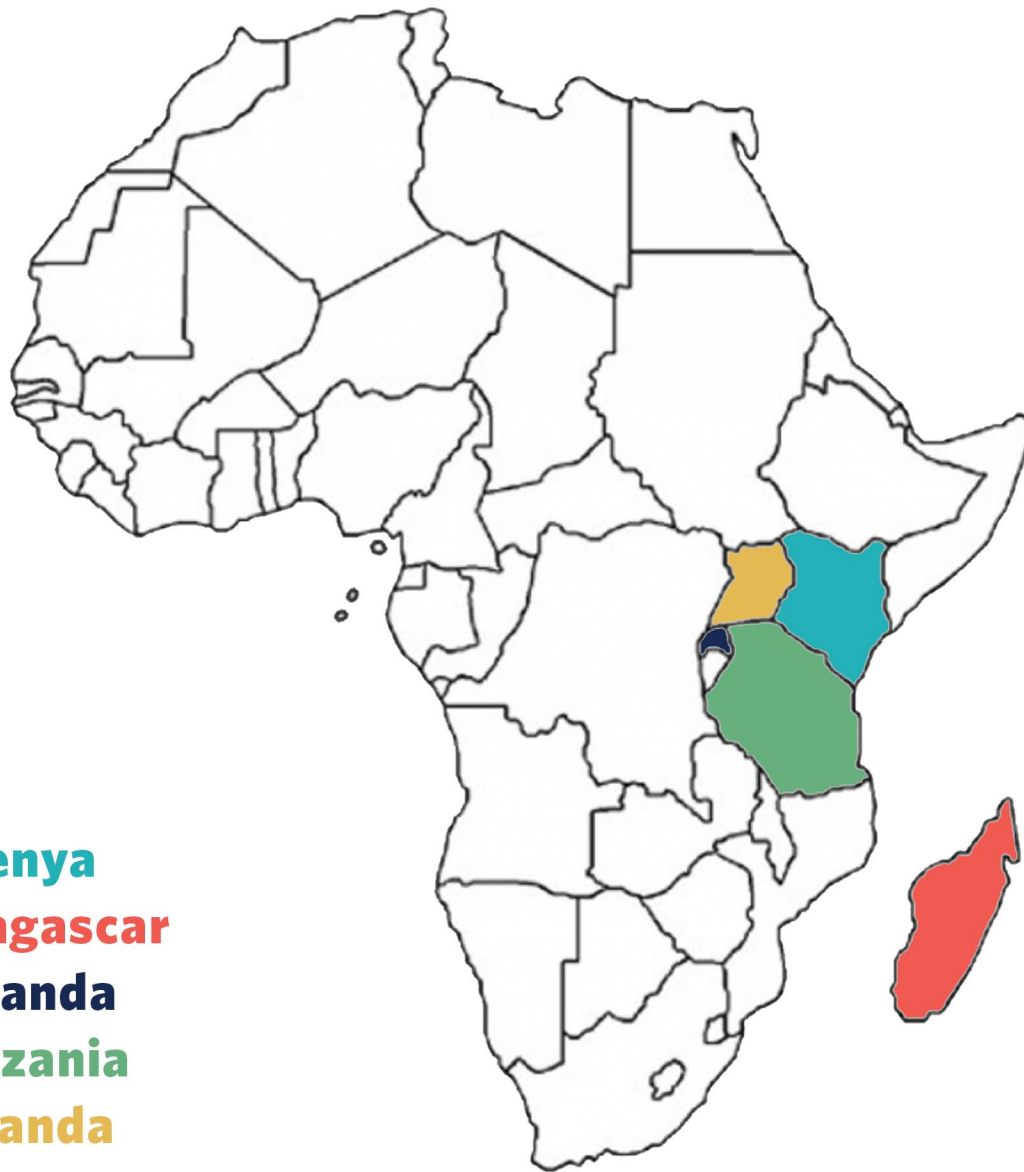

UNBOUND'S NEWEST PROGRAM IN AFRICA

Officially named *Republic of Rwanda* and is one of the smallest countries in Africa.

The capital of Rwanda is Kigali, which was declared Africa's most beautiful city by the United Nations.

Music and dance are an integral part of Rwandan ceremonies, festivals, social gatherings and storytelling.

The official language of Rwanda is *Kinyarwanda*.

There are 3 national parks: Nyungwe Forest National Park, Akagera National Park & Volcanoes National Park, which is home to about one third of the worldwide mountain gorilla population.

A global leader in caring for the environment.

Rwanda has a temperate tropical highland climate.

There is little change through the year.

Many of the country's morals and history have been passed down through poetry and folk stories.

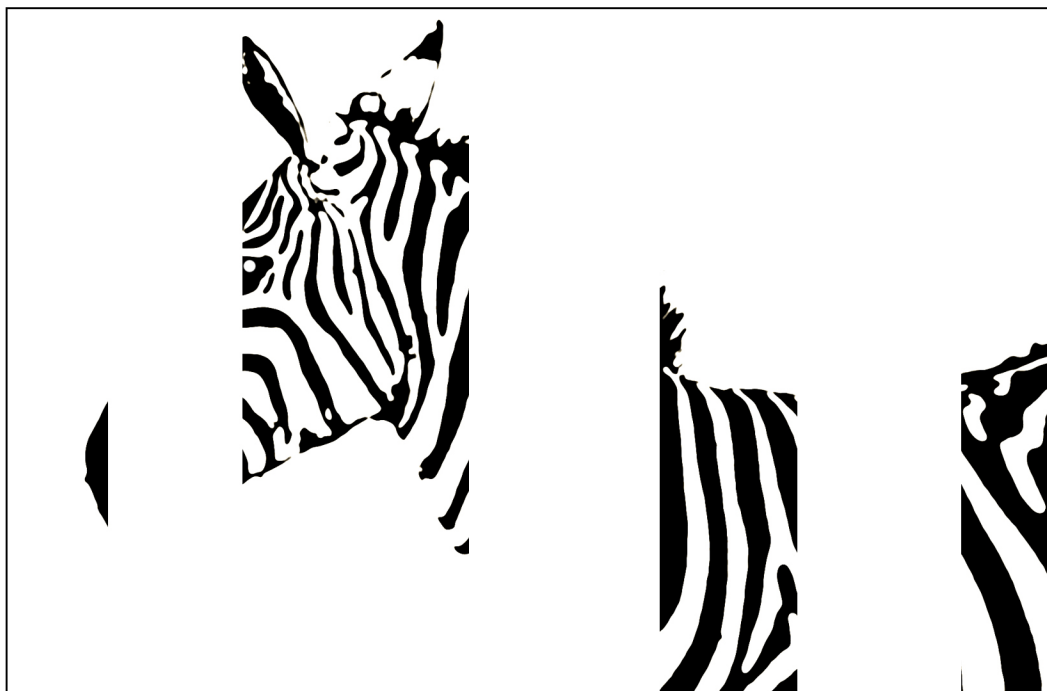
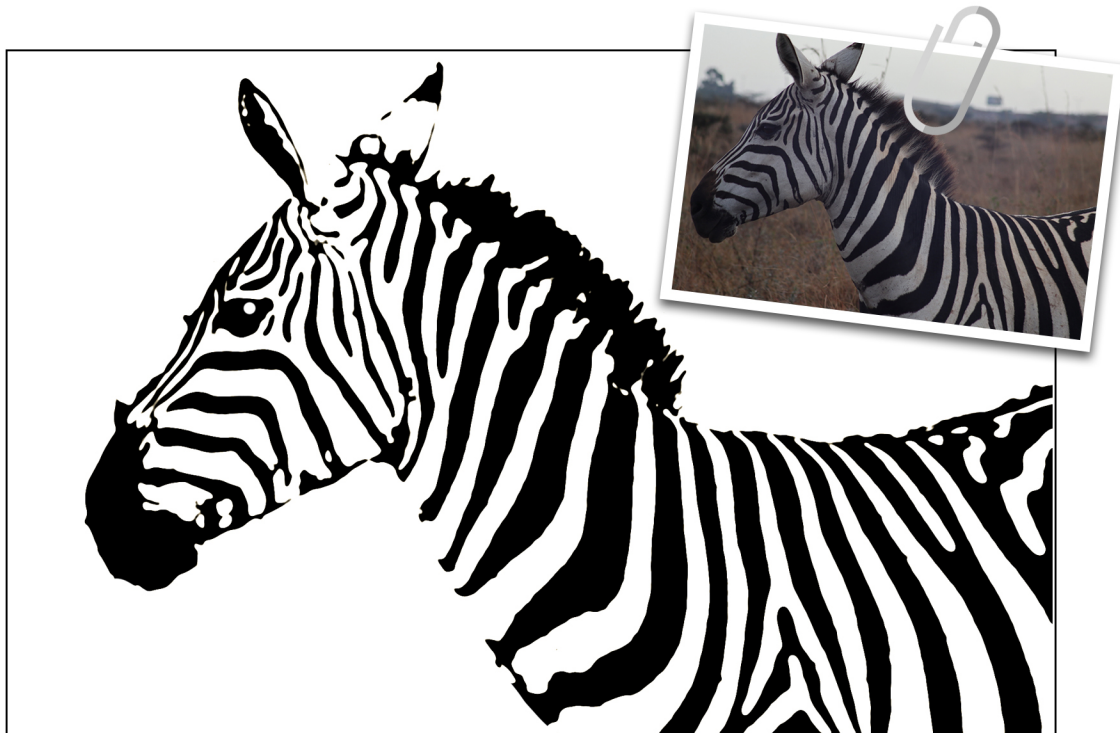

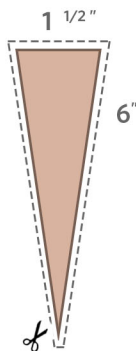

LEARN HOW TO MAKE A PAPER-BEADED BRACELET

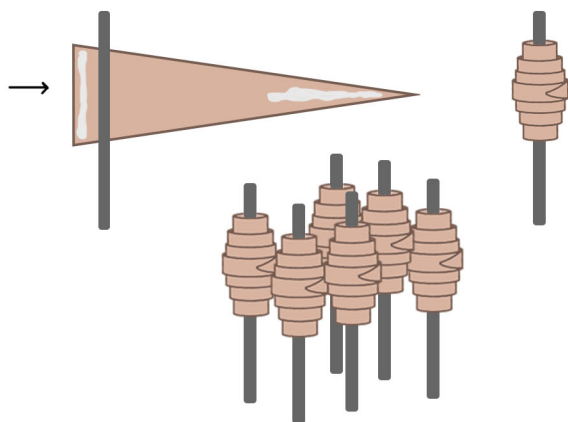
1 THE PAPER & SHAPE

- Measure 1/2-inch by 6-inch triangles on the paper being used. About 10 strips will create a bracelet.
- Use scissors or a paper cutter to cut out each triangle.



2 THE BEADS

- Place a bamboo skewer (or a toothpick) on the wide edge of the paper strip. Add a line of glue at both ends of the paper. Start rolling the wide strip of paper toward the point, using the bamboo skewer to keep its shape.
- Add a light coat of craft glue to the outside of the bead to make sure it's secure. Continue this process until you have formed all of the beads.



- Allow the glue on the beads to dry completely before completing the next step.
- Seal by adding a layer of modge podge to each bead.
- Allow all of the beads to dry fully (about an hour or so).

SUPPLIES

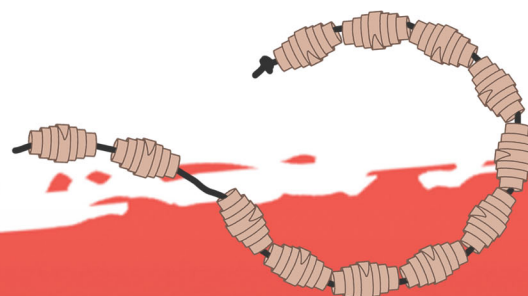
- Paper (magazines, scrapbook paper, junk mail, printer paper, etc.)
- Scissors or Paper Cutter
- Ruler
- Pencil
- Bamboo Skewer or Toothpick
- String
- Modge Podge - Gloss
- Craft Glue

Optional:

- Craft Paint
- Paint Brush

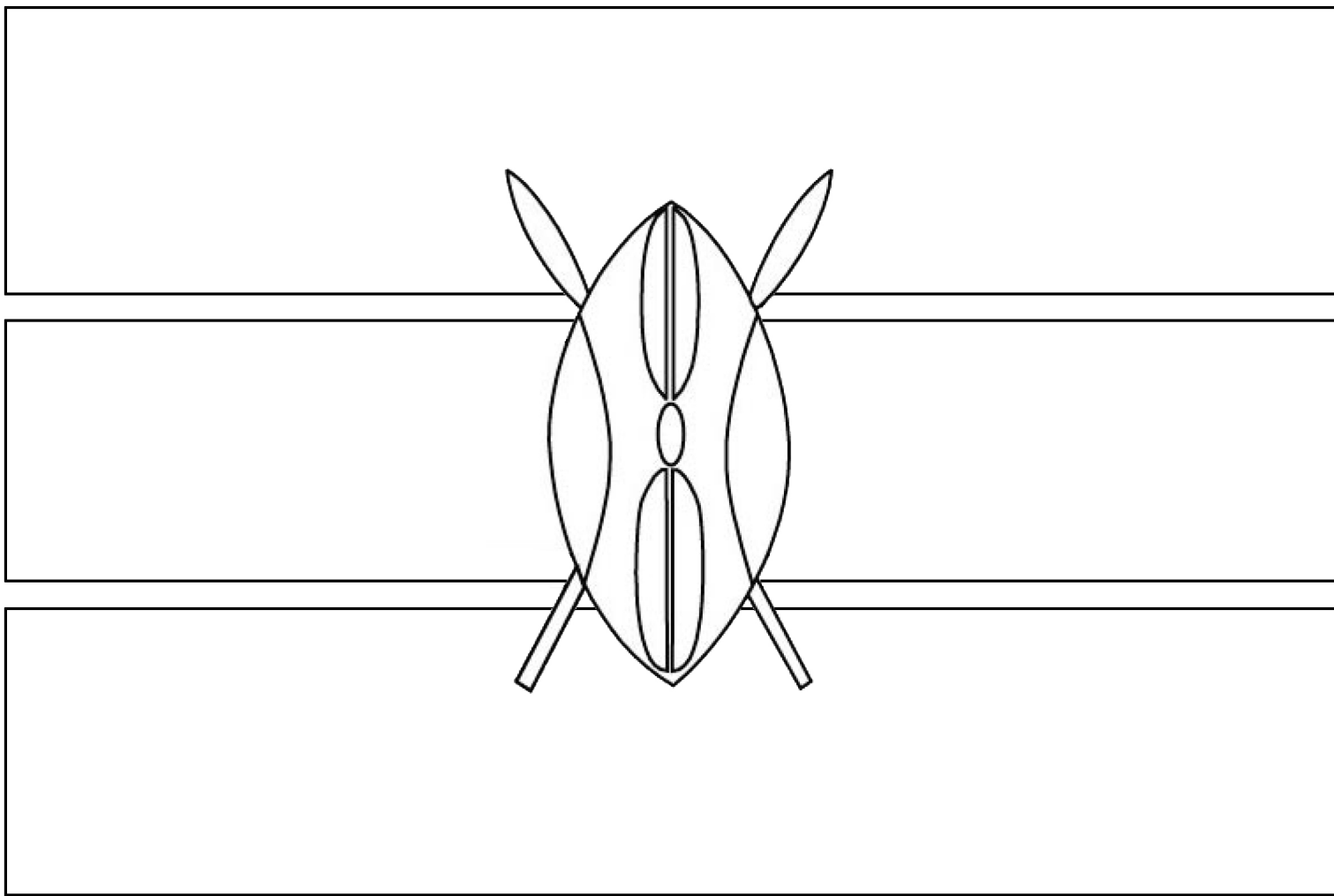
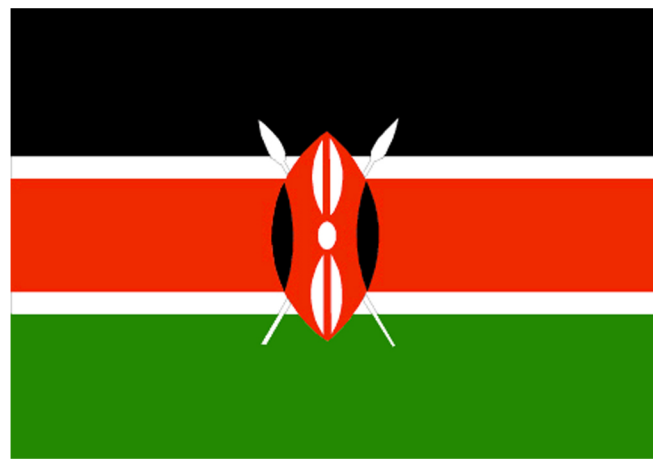
3 THE BRACELET

- Before cutting the string for the bracelet, wrap it around the wrist to measure the size. Add an additional 3 inches to the length to give room to tie the bracelet.
- Begin making your bracelet by stringing the beads onto the string.
- Tie a firm knot at either end to keep the beads in place.



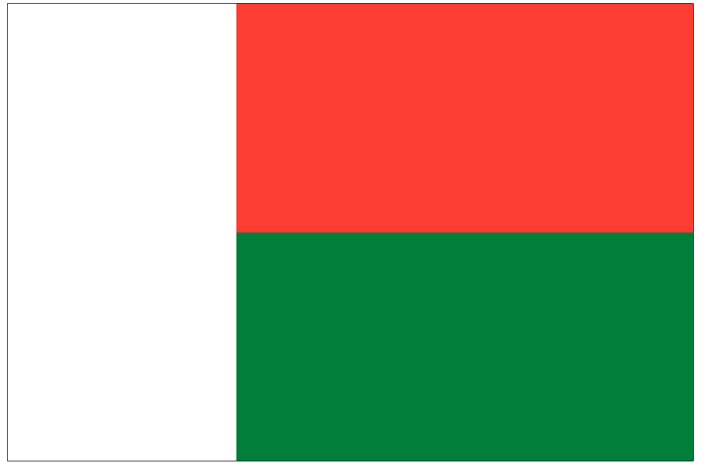

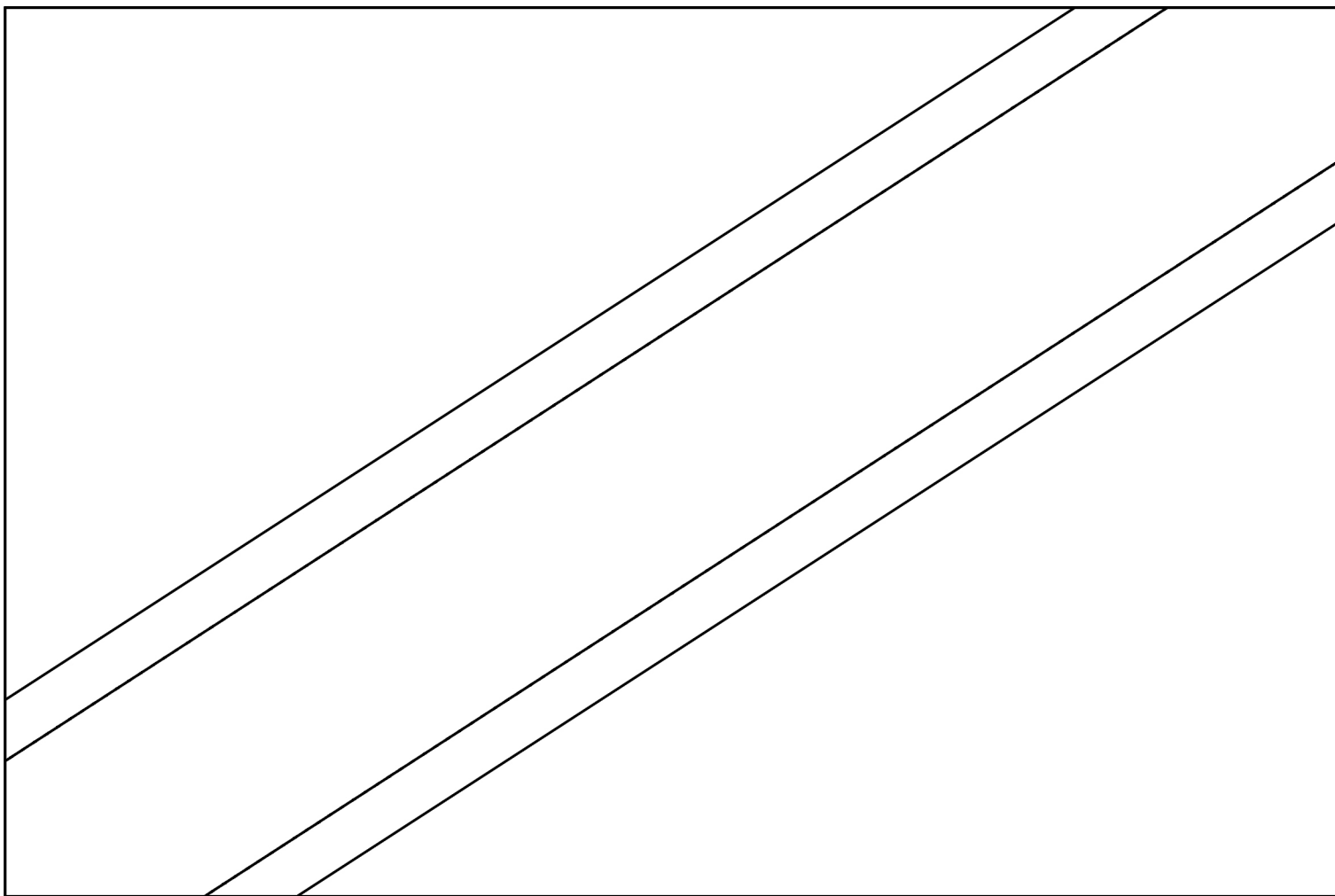

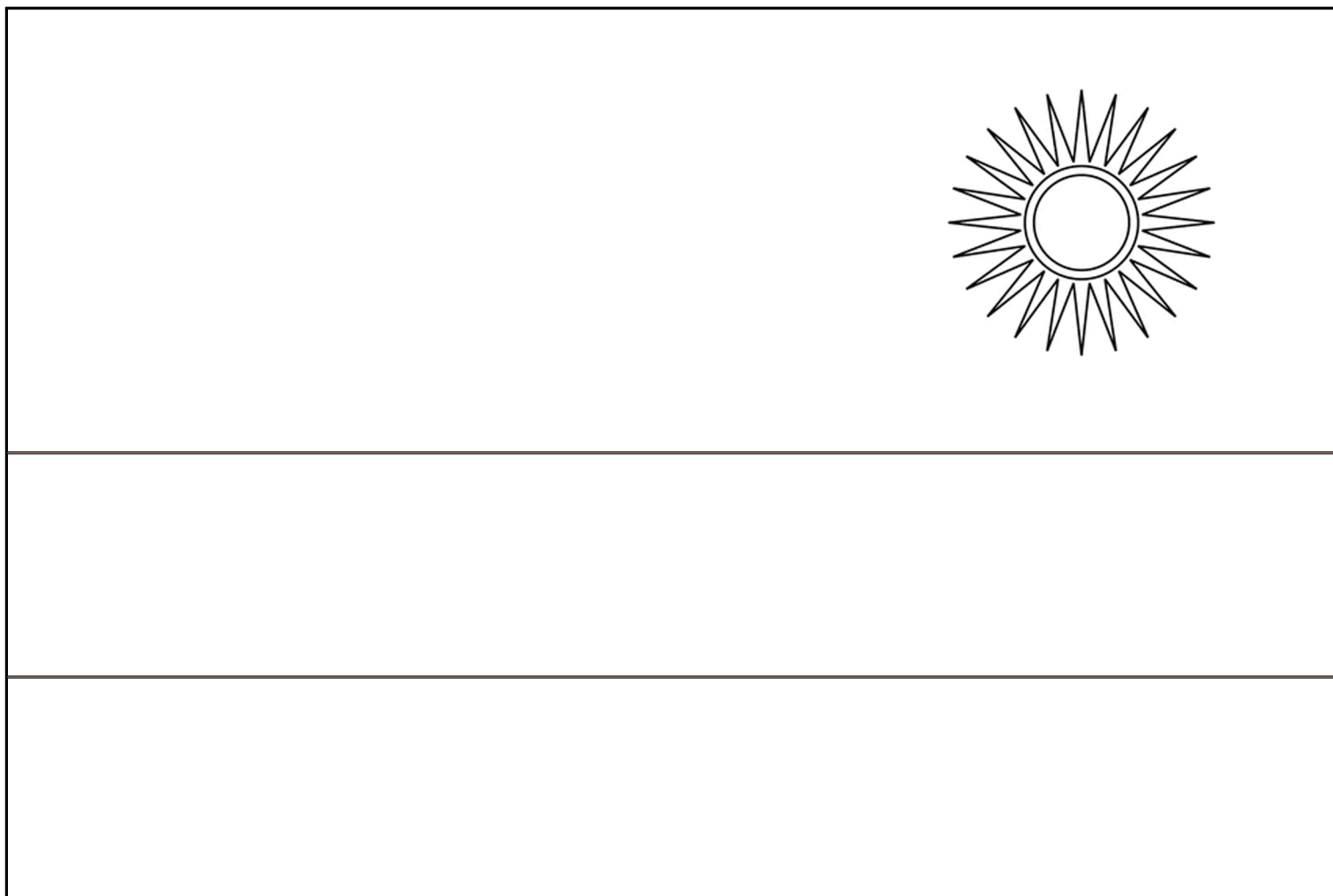
