Language is key to friendships in Unbound. Sponsors receive their friends' letters written in the language of their region, along with an English translation when needed.


Fun fact: 93 languages are spoken by families in Unbound.

Check out the country maps below and note the languages spoken in each country. Then take our five-question quiz at the end.




















Quick quiz
